

daylesford ORGANIC

Our walks are open all year round and are clearly signposted.

Explore organic farmland, discover our heritage breed animals and the surrounding wildlife, stopping off in Kingham, Bledington or Lower Oddington. All walks are affected by rainfall, wearing appropriate waterproof footwear is advisable throughout the year.

Please note, footpaths can become rough in poor weather and unsuitable for pushchairs and small children.

Daylesford is a working farm and we ask that you take care when exploring the countryside, keeping to the public footpaths and being mindful of farm machinery and animals. Please keep dogs on leads at all times and close all gates.

KINGHAM Approximately 40 minutes. The Wild Rabbit pub is en route.

ODDINGTON ASHES Approximately 1 hour.

DAYLESFORD Approximately 1½ hours.

LOWER ODDINGTON Approximately 2 hours. Please take extra care along the A436. The Fox pub is en route.

BLEDINGTON Approximately 2 hours. Please take extra care when crossing the railway line and Evenlode river. The Wild Rabbit pub is en route.

NOTES ON THE WALKS

All walks begin in the field opposite the farmshop and Bamford Wellness Spa car park, follow the signpost around our dairy paddock.

KINGHAM

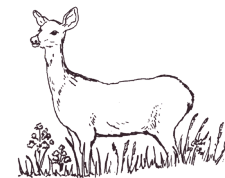
On leaving the dairy paddock, turn left onto the bridleway heading towards Kingham. Follow the signposts for Kingham and continue along the bridleway to Kingham Village. The Wild Rabbit can be found on Church Street.

ODDINGTON ASHES

On leaving the dairy paddock, turn right and follow the signposts for Lower Oddington. Follow the farm track over the railway bridge and over the river Evenlode and then turn left into the field to Oddington Ashes. Follow the signpost into the woodland through the gate and keep to the footpath through the woods until you reach the other side. Follow the signposts to return to Daylesford. This walk is likely to flood and be extremely muddy during the winter months.

DAYLESFORD

On leaving the dairy paddock, turn left onto the bridleway heading towards Kingham. Continue until you reach the hen field, then turn right onto the public footpath across the opposite field. Cross the railway bridge and continue across the two fields and river Evenlode towards Oddington Ashes. Turn right, following the public footpath signs through the woodland, until you reach the Daylesford farm track. Follow the signposts to return to Daylesford. This walk is likely to flood and be extremely muddy during the winter months.



LOWER ODDINGTON

On leaving the dairy paddock, turn left onto the bridleway heading towards Kingham. Continue until you reach the hen field, then turn right onto the public footpath across the opposite field. Cross the railway bridge and continue across two fields and the river Evenlode towards Oddington Ashes. Turn right and follow the public footpath signs towards Lower Oddington. Walk across the Daylesford farm track and continue along the public footpath towards Church Road. Passing Lower Oddington Church on your right, continue onwards into Lower Oddington Village. Turn right when you reach the end of Church Road. Continue onwards past The Fox pub on your left until you reach the A436. Turn right again and take care walking along the public footpath, turn right when you reach the signpost back to Daylesford. The road to Daylesford is busy with blind corners and a narrow footpath, please take extreme care when crossing the road.

BLEMINGTON

On leaving the dairy paddock, turn left onto the bridleway heading towards Kingham. Follow the signposts for Kingham continuing along the bridleway to Kingham Village. Make your way through Kingham Village, along West End turning right onto Cozens Lane. Turn right by The Wild Rabbit onto Church Street and continue along Station Road. You will approach Field Road on your right, follow the public footpath signs towards Bledington. You will approach the Cotswold railway line, cross this with caution and care, cross the river Evenlode over two bridges. Following the public footpath signs, make your way up to the top of the old railway bridge, turn right and walk along it until you reach the downward turning on the left and make your way down the other side. Walk across two fields, carefully crossing the river, walking towards the outskirts of Bledington Village straight ahead. On entering Bledington Village you will join Main Street, turn right and make your way towards the centre of the Village. Walk past The King's Head pub on your left, making your way out of the Village. When you pass the last house on the right, turn right onto the public byway. Continue following the signs along the track until you reach the Oddington Ashes. Carry on through the woodland and join the Daylesford farm track. Follow the signposts back to Daylesford. This walk is likely to flood and be extremely muddy during the winter months.
